

Key objectives included mastering CPR techniques for pediatric patients, managing airway obstruction and cardiac arrest, enhancing critical thinking in high-pressure emergency situations, and building confidence through hands-on simulations and skill-based training.



5. World Suicide Prevention Day Observance

The Department of Mental Health Nursing at KMCH College of Nursing observed World Suicide Prevention Day with a guest lecture on September 15, 2025. The event aimed to raise awareness and strengthen commitment to suicide prevention among nursing students and faculty, aligning with the WHO's theme "Changing the Narrative on Suicide."


6. Disaster Management Workshop with Mock Drill (Oct 8–10, 2025)




2. Fit India Program (Aug 29, 2025)
